| Post holiday safe driving messages on the school marquee daily (you can also ask local businesses to do this on their marquee boards!). |

The Facts about Teens, Driving and Alcohol

Use these facts:

- On morning or school television announcements
 - As an email or text to students
 - As Twitter, Instagram, or Facebook posts

Encourage Teens to Celebrate Responsibly, Drive Safely, and Buckle Up!

National Statistics

- → Each year, approximately 5,000 young people under age 21 die due to underage drinking.
- → About 1,900 (38%) of these deaths are from alcohol-related motor vehicle crashes.
- → Youth who begin drinking before the age of 15 are four times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than those who wait until age 21.

National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism

→ Young drivers (ages 16-20) are 17 times more likely to die in a crash when they have a blood alcohol concentration of .08% than when they have not been drinking.

(* It is illegal for adults 21 and over to drive with a BAC of .08% or higher. It is illegal for anyone under age 21 to consume alcohol in all US states.)

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

2021 Virginia Statistics:

- → 60 teens were killed in motor vehicle crashes
- → Alcohol was a factor in 19% (17) of the fatal crashes involving teen drivers ages 15-19
 - → 16 teenagers, age 15-19, were killed in alcohol-related crashes
 - → 85 teenagers, age 15-19, were seriously injured in alcohol-related crashes
 - → 290 teenagers, age 15-19, were injured in alcohol-related crashes

Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles

Virginia's Zero Tolerance Law

Virginia's Zero Tolerance law makes consuming alcohol or driving under the influence of any amount of alcohol a serious criminal offense for teens under the age of 21. (Va. Code 18.2-266.1)

Teens convicted under the law with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of between 0.02 and 0.08 will lose their license for one year from the date of conviction <u>and</u> pay a minimum fine of \$500 or complete at least 50 hours of community service.

Teens who use alcohol or drive impaired will receive plenty of unwanted and costly "gifts" this holiday season if convicted under the Zero Tolerance Law with a BAC of .02 or higher:

- \$ Attorney fees and court costs
- \$ Car repairs
- \$ High insurance rates
- \$ Loss of driver's license for 1 year
- \$ A \$500 fine or 50 hours of community service
- \$ Grounded by your parents
- **\$** Teens who are caught and convicted of driving with a BAC of .08 or higher are subject to the same penalties as an adult for first time offense:
 - Minimum \$250 fine
 - · Loss of driver's license for 1 year
 - Ignition interlock installed on vehicle

Teens who purchase, possess and/or consume alcohol face:

- A fine ranging from \$500 to \$2,500
- Up to 12 months in jail
- Mandatory suspension of driver's license for at least 6 months but not more than 1 year

How Parents Can Help Keep Teens Safe:

| | Lock up and keep track of all alcohol in the home |

| | Have a discussion with your teen about Virginia's Zero Tolerance Law and the consequences of breaking the law |
| | Talk to your teens about how to resist peer pressure to drink alcohol and/or use drugs |
| | Make sure your teen knows he/she can call you to be picked up if the person he/she is riding with has used drugs and/or alcohol or if the teen makes a poor decision to use an illegal substance. Getting your teen home safely is the most important thing you can do for your teen. |
| | Set rules, enforce teen curfew laws, enforce teen passenger restriction laws and make sure your teen always buckles up! |
| | Make a teen safe driving and passenger safety contract signed by both parents and the teen. Review the rules and consequences with your teen. Always strictly enforce the consequences to make sure your teen understands the importance of being safe and responsible in a vehicle. For sample contracts, go to: |

Test Your Knowledge - Winter Weather Driving

- If moisture or frost clouds the inside of windows while driving, what should you do?
 Stop in a safe area and remove it. Turn on air conditioning to keep insides of windows clear and dry.
- 2. Should you over inflate or under inflate your tires during cold winter months?

 Neither. Tires should always be maintained at the level recommended by the manufacturer.
- 3. When heading down a snowy or icy hill, what should you do?

 Shift into a lower gear before making your descent and maintain a slow steady speed.
- 4. What should be included in an emergency winter driving kit?

Small snow shovel, small bag of rock salt, sand or clay cat litter to generate traction, a windshield scraper and brush, flashlight and extra batteries, jumper cables, blankets, tool kit, brightly colored cloth to use as a flag, and a first aid kit.

5. Is it safe to drive with cruise control on when it is raining or snowing?

No. On wet roads, cruise control set at too fast a speed could cause the vehicle to hydroplane when it encounters standing water. On very low-traction surfaces such as ice and snow, cruise control operation can result in a skid or spin.

6. If caught in a snow storm and you have to walk in the street, should you walk in the same direction as the traffic or facing oncoming traffic?

Always walk facing the oncoming traffic.

7. If your car is equipped with anti-lock brakes and you are braking on snow or ice, what should you do?

Apply firm and continuous pressure. If your car does not have anti-lock brakes, you can mimic that effect by pumping the brakes.

8. When approaching a snowy or icy hill, what should you do?

Approach it at a slow speed and maintain that slow speed at a steady rate.

9. When sliding into a skid, it is best to do what?

Turn in the direction of the skid.
