Tips for the Road

Check Wiper Blades & Fluid Levels.

To maximize visibility during winter weather, be sure to check your windshield wiper fluid level and make sure your wiper blades are in good condition.

Allow Longer Stopping Distance & Reduce Speed.

It takes extra time and distance to bring your car to a stop on slick and snowy roads. Leave extra space between you and the vehicle in front of you and keep speeds low to avoid slipping and sliding.

Steer, Brake & Accelerate Slowly.

Avoid too many excessive maneuvers when driving in snow and ice to lessen the chances of sliding and losing control of the vehicle. Brake and accelerate slowly and never slam on the brakes.

Enter Traffic Cautiously.

Don't take chances when pulling out into traffic. Other vehicles won't be able to slow down quickly and you won't be able to accelerate quickly.

Beware of Black Ice.

Black ice is a thin coating of clear ice that forms on the road and is difficult to see. Slow down when approaching intersections, off-ramps, bridges, or shady spots where black ice typically forms.
